

Louise High School Return to School Plan

Parents, please assess your family's needs and choose a learning option that fits the needs of your high school student(s). After choosing a method of learning the student will need to maintain that option for the full six-weeks. If a situation changes for a family, please call to schedule a meeting with Donna Kutac.

Please do what's best for your family. Be assured we will strongly encourage students to social distance; however, disciplinary consequences will not be given. Feel free to contact me with any questions that you may have about any of these options. We are all in this together, and I'm here to help serve you and your student.

Types of learning options:

○ Face-to-face:

You can return to school in person as normal and participate as "normal" as possible.

- Students will be instructed to social distance as much as possible.
- Face covers will be required for everyone over the age of 10 per Governor Abbott's order from July 2, 2020.
- Students who are experiencing any possible COVID-19 symptoms are asked to stay home.
- Students will be screened upon arriving to school or getting on the bus each morning. Temperatures will need to be less than 100° to enter school or get on the bus.
- High School students wanting breakfast can go to the cafeteria before school, purchase their breakfast and leave the cafeteria.

High school students will also have a separate lunch from Elementary and Jr. High.

- Each classroom will have disinfectant (wipes). Students will be asked to clean their desk/area upon arrival to the classroom and before leaving the classroom.
- Students will need to bring a water bottle that can be refilled as need from the water fountains or student may purchase a water bottle from the water machine in the foyer.
- Morning buses will drop off at 3 locations: Cafeteria- Pre-K-5th grades; Jr High main entrance 6th grade students and 7th & 8th grade PE students; High School 7th & 8th grade athletes and high school students. This alleviates crowding of students at the cafeteria area. Face covers will be required on the bus as well.

Remote Synchronous Instruction:

Remote Synchronous Instruction – Two-way, real-time/live, virtual instruction between teachers and students when students are not on campus. In this method, the required amount of instructional time is scheduled each day, and funding is generated when attendance is recorded daily at a locally selected snapshot time. Synchronous instruction is provided through a computer or other electronic device or over the phone. The instructional method must address the required curriculum, per TEC, §28.002.

- Synchronous instruction is the preferred way of attending high school classes from home.
- Students will log into Google Classroom and follow their assigned high school schedule each day.
- Students will use Google Meets and will be able join in each class in real time.
- The student will be able to ask questions while their fellow classmates are in class at the same time.
- Students will turn in daily assignments in the same time frame as the student in the face to face classes.

- Students will log into Google Classroom & the Google Meets program for the class and turn in daily assignments to receive attendance credit and must turn in daily assignments to show progress for each class attended.

Remote Asynchronous Instruction

Instruction that does not require having the instructor and student engaged at the same time. In this method, students learn from instruction that is not necessarily being delivered in-person or in real time. This type of instruction may include various forms of digital and online learning, such as prerecorded video lessons or game-based learning tasks that students complete on their own, and pre-assigned work and formative assessments made available to students on paper. The instructional method must address the required curriculum, per TEC, §28.002.

- Students will log into Google Classroom watch recorded synchronized instructional videos from that day's lesson.
- Students will complete and submit daily assignments allotted in the time frame posted in google classroom.
- Asynchronous questions will be submitted via Google Classroom and teachers will be reply in a timely manner.
- Parents will have to schedule appointments to pick any paper copies needed to complete all assignments and return daily for teacher to measure daily progress in each class.
- If asynchronous Instruction isn't working for your student, you can always choose synchronized instruction and still work from home.
- All tests should be completed as synchronized instruction only.
