Level 3 Offenses:

Level 3 offenses include those that are outlined in Chapter 37 of the Texas Education Code. They involve the most serious of offenses that pertain to vaping, weapons, drugs, sexual misconduct, aggravated assault, etc. Disciplinary action will include one or more of the following depending on the circumstances – In-School Suspension, Out-of-School Suspension, DAEP, or Expulsion.

Additional Disciplinary Procedures:

Tardies:

At the beginning of every six weeks grading period, students will be given a color-coded sheet of card stock that contains 10 hall passes. Students may use these for being tardy, using the restroom, using the water fountain, etc. After all hall passes have been used, any reason for a student not being on time or leaving class will result in an after-school detention. Failure to attend an after-school detention will result in 2 days of after school detention.

Cafeteria:

Cafeteria rules that are broken may result in cafeteria duty and/or lunch detention.

Corporal Punishment:

Only with the approval of the student, parent, and administration will corporal punishment be given. A student may receive 1 pop in lieu of serving an after-school detention or 2 pops in lieu of serving an ISS.

Saturday School:

Students may be assigned to attend a Saturday School for excessive absences, missing work, or level one offenses. Saturday School hours are from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

After School Detentions:

After school detentions will be held on Monday through Thursday from 3:45p.m. to 4:45 p.m. The student will either work on homework, read a book, or complete an assignment given by the teacher/monitor. If a student is involved in athletics, discipline may be handled by a coach instead of serving an after-school detention.

Cell Phones:

Students are allowed to use their cell phones before, after school, and during lunch. They are otherwise to be turned off and put away in the student's backpack and are not allowed to be used during passing periods or class time unless directed by a teacher or administrator.

If a student uses a telecommunications device without authorization during the school day, the device will be confiscated.

First Offense – Electronic device will be confiscated, sent to office, and a parent is responsible for picking up the item after school that day.

Second Offense – Electronic device will be confiscated, and a \$15 fee must be paid to the office before the item may be released. In addition, a parent is responsible for picking up the item after school. Any disciplinary action will be in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

Third Offense – Electronic device will be confiscated, locked in the office, and may be retrieved the last day of the school semester. Any disciplinary action will be in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

Bus Incidents: Disciplinary action regarding bus incidents will be as follows:

1st offense: Administrator/Student Conference and Parent Contact

2nd offense: three-day bus suspension

3th offense: one-week bus suspension

4th offense: six weeks bus suspension

5th offense: bus suspension until end of school year
